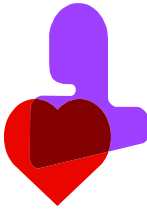

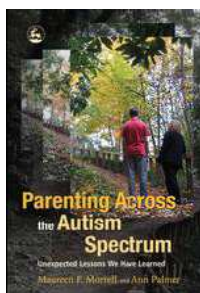
This group is sponsored by FSN-HC and Watauga Youth Network.
